The Thesis focused on the impact of ethnic identity on stressors and stress. This is an area that little is known about and has the potential to impact the well-being of immigrant college students and undergraduate retention rates for international students. The thesis will be funded by the Office of Humanities and Social Sciences. Data collection is projected to begin in January.

Graduate Research Project Virtual Augmented Reality Lab Advisor: Dr. Christopher Shelton

This project is a collaborative effort to develop an intervention strategy using Virtual Reality that aids in decreasing stress and improving affect for international students. In this study, participants will be recruited to complete a pre-test, attend two VR sessions using Google Earth to visit their hometown, and complete a post-test. Currently, training undergraduate students to manage participants and provide instructions on using VR technology. The study has received \$400 in funding from Penn State Behrend's International Student Office.

I am engaged in an independent project focusing on trauma, PTSD, and stress within Latin and Asian immigrant populations. The objective of this study is to gain insights into the variations in minority experiences, aiming to develop culturally sensitive interventions. The data utilized is sourced from the National Asian and Latin Study. In the initial stage of this

study, a hierarchical regression was employed to comprehend differences in trauma exposure and the expression of PTSD symptoms. This research is a component of a scholarship project supported by Penn State Behrend's Office of Humanities and Social Sciences, with an awarded scholarship amount of \$8,000 per year.

Food Insecurity and Disordered Eating, *Penn State University* Principle Investigator: Dr. Melanie Hetzel-Riggin

This project is conducted with collaborations from different departments at Penn State Behrend. The goal of the project was to understand the relationship between food insecurity, climate anxiety, and disordered eating in college students. The study serves as a needs assessment, and the results will be used to develop resources for students. Responsibilities include developing the survey, recruiting over 500 participants, coordinating compensation distribution, data cleaning, and data analysis. A manuscript will be submitted regarding the results of the overall study. An independent project was developed from this data, and the findings were presented as a poster at a national research conference.
