

LECTURER, Advanced Graduate Degree Programs, School Psychology (SPSY) GRADUATE SCHOOL OF EDUCATION

The Graduate School of Education (GSE) seeks a non-tenure track, part-time, Lecturer to teach in the School Psychology Program. Lecturers will be hired to teach in Fall 2019 or Spring 2020. The final deadline date for this recruitment is March 23, 2020.

Teaching Responsibilities: We are seeking an outstanding lecturer who can teach courses in the school's advanced degree program: School Psychology. Refer to gse.berkeley.edu/cognition-development/school-psychology for details on the program.

General Duties: In addition to teaching responsibilities, duties include holding office hours, assigning grades, advising students, and preparing course materials.

Basic Qualifications (by start date): Doctoral degree or equivalent degree in school psychology, clinical psychology, or counseling psychology, certification as a school psychologist and licensure as a psychologist at time of application.

Additional Qualifications: The successful candidate will have two or more years teaching experience in the subject matter field and with diverse populations by the start date of the position.

The Graduate School of Education is interested in candidates who will contribute to diversity and equal opportunity in higher education through their teaching. Qualified women and members of underrepresented minority groups are strongly encouraged to apply. Salary: This is an academic year appointment and subject to the normal processes of academic review. Salary is commensurate with experience but typically begins at \$61,930 and is prorated in accordance to instructional workload calculation.
